Register Your Team

Every team needs to have a small group of leaders to be responsible for the team. Once these people are chosen, you may register your team.

ComedySportz can help you along the way if you have trouble!

Every team should have a *Team Administrator* (a faculty member at the school), *Team Captain(s)*: (1-2 students who commit to helping their team) and, of course, a *Team* (6-30 students).

Pay the Annual Tuition

Schools new to the ComedySportz High School League pay an annual tuition of \$750 - this includes additional support and a referee for their first match. Returning schools from the previous year pay a discounted rate of \$500. Many schools make the team fee back in their first few matches and use the rest of their shows to raise funds! You can also pay in 2 installments. If all else fails, call us! We have never turned down a school because of a financial problem.

Perform a ComedySportz Match!

All ComedySportz High School League matches are refereed by an approved, professional ComedySportz Referee, to ensure that your match will run smoothly and that your team shines.

After you hire a Referee for a ComedySportz match at your school, you keep all the money from ticket sales, concession sales, and any other ways you choose to make money.

HOW IT WORKS

(aka Necessary Details Your School Will Want to know)

Once your school is registered and accepted into the ComedySportz Boston High School League:

- We will send a welcome email to your Team Administrator and Team Captains and include a Best Practices packet, as a guide and resource.
- You'll schedule your 2 private workshop with Courtney, our High School League Director.
- We will send a Coach to your school to lead the 2 private workshops.
- You'll run regular team practices; Schedule and frequency decided by Team Captain(s)
- You'll schedule ComedySportz matches for your team there is no limit! and hire a referee for each one. (Referees are \$50/match).
- ComedySportz matches are open to your friends & family and held at your school unless otherwise approved by your Team Administrator. Additionally, any "Away" matches for inter-school activities require approval from both participating schools and their Team Administrators.
